We strongly encourage you to have your essay reviewed by the University Writing Center prior to submission, as a panel of UT faculty members whose research and teaching interests relate to your BDP topic will evaluate your application essay.

Other Application Items (required for some students):

- If you are graduating Spring 2027 or earlier, the application will prompt you to submit a <u>semester course</u>
 <u>planner</u> that is designed to outline your plan for completing the BDP alongside your remaining degree
 requirements before your intended graduation. Please meet with your major academic advisor to review
 your semester course planner prior to submitting it.
- If your cumulative UT Austin GPA is in the 2.0-3.0 range, the application will prompt you to submit a GPA statement. This should be a brief (1-2 paragraph) statement, explaining any extenuating circumstances regarding your grades as well as any updates on your academic progress. This is your opportunity to express to the panel why your GPA is lower than you'd like it to be, any circumstances that contributed to this, and the steps you are taking to improve it.
